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### Quick Answers

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#### Q: Can you visit Flamingo Beach without staying at the Renaissance hotel?

A: Yes, but you need a day pass. Renaissance Island is private and owned by the Renaissance Wind Creek Aruba Resort. Non-guests can purchase a day pass online or at the resort desk, but availability is limited and sold on a first-come first-served basis.

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#### Q: How much does the Renaissance Island day pass cost?

A: The day pass for non-hotel guests runs approximately \$125–\$130 USD per person as of 2025–2026. Some packages include a food and beverage credit (around \$25), which offsets part of the cost. Prices are subject to change and should be verified with the resort before booking.

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#### Q: How do you get to Renaissance Island from the mainland?

A: An 8-minute water taxi runs from the Renaissance Wind Creek Aruba Resort in downtown Oranjestad. The ride is included for hotel guests and day-pass holders. The pier is located at the resort's marina — you'll check in at the island desk before boarding.
